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### How to read your gas bill [1]

Below is a simplified example of a typical gas bill. It may be useful to have your own gas bill handy to compare.

### Where to call for help

#### **Retailer contact details**

Your retailer is the company that bills you for your gas. If you have a question about your bill or gas contract, you should contact your retailer.

#### **Distributor contact details**

Your distributor is responsible for the poles, wires and meter that connect you to the electricity network. Sometimes your distributor's name is included on your bill, other times their phone number is listed beside 'Faults and emergencies'. Your distributor's contact details are generally on the right-hand side of the front page of your bill, just below your retailer's contact details.

You should contact your distributor for faults and emergencies relating to your electricity supply.



Your gas bill displays a comparison of your gas usage over time. Gas retailers generally display this in either a graph or table. This information may be on the front or back page of your bill.

#### MIRN

This is your Meter Installation Registration Number (MIRN). It is a unique number assigned to your gas service by your distributor and used by your distributor and retailers to identify your connection point.

#### **Plan name**

This is the name of the tariff or plan you are on. If you cannot find this on your bill, you can contact your retailer and ask them. You might also find it on the front page of your bill.

#### Last meter read

This shows the date you meter was last read, and if it was an actual, or an estimated reading.

#### **Tariff description**

This shows the type of tariff you are on. Sometimes this might be shown on the front of your bill instead.

#### **Billing period**

#### This is the billing period for your bill, and is where you can find the start and end date for your bill, that you can enter to compare electricity offers on Energy Made Easy.

#### **Block tariffs**

Sometimes your plan will include block tariffs, where one block or quantity of usage is charged at a different rate to the next. For \$110.69 example, with the plan on this sample bill, the first 4000 MJ have been charged at 2.52 cents per MJ, while the remaining 4763 MJ were charged at 2.32 cents per MJ.

#### Daily supply charge

This is also known as the fixed charge, or service to property charge. \$52.37

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Your gas bill contains a lot of information. You might not understand some of the terms in it. This page will help you understand the most important parts of your gas bill.

## Account summary

Your account summary contains a summary of your gas charges. It can include:

- the amount you owe
- amounts you have recently paid
- overdue amounts
- adjustments, and
- discounts and rebates.

## Meter Installation Registration Number (MIRN)

Your gas meter has its own Meter Installation Registration Number (MIRN). The MIRN identifies your property.

## **Retailer contact details**

Your retailer is the company that bills you for your gas. If you have a question about your gas bill or contract, contact your retailer.

## **Distributor contact details**

Some retailers show the distributor's name and contact details separately. Other retailers show the distributor's phone number as the 'Faults and emergencies' contact number.

When you look at the front page of your bill, your distributor's contact details are generally on the right hand side. Look just below your retailer's contact details.

Your distributor owns the pipes and meter that connect you to the gas network. Contact your distributor for faults and emergencies with your gas.

## Next scheduled reading

Your next meter reading will occur on or around this date.

### Last meter reading

This shows the date your meter was last read.

## Actual or estimated meter readings

Your bill will state if your usage is based on an **actual** reading or an **estimated** [4] reading of your meter.

An 'A' or the word 'actual' next to your usage means that your usage is based on an actual reading of your meter.

An 'E' or the word 'estimated' next to your usage means that:

- your meter was not read during this billing period, and
- your usage has been estimated.

If the estimate is too high or too low, your next bill will include a credit or an additional amount to pay. This means you only pay for the gas you use.

### **Tariff name**

This is the name of the tariff or plan you are on. If your plan name is shown on your bill, it will probably be on the front page. If you can't find this on your bill, contact your retailer.

## **Usage and supply charges**

Depending on your tariff type, you may not see all of these types of charges on your bill.

## **Billing period**

The billing period shows the start and end date for your bill.

To compare offers on the Energy Made Easy site using your usage information from a recent bill, enter the billing period.

## Megajoule (MJ)

Megajoules (MJ) are the measure that is used on your gas bill. Your total MJ usage shows the total amount of gas you have used over the billing period.

This is the usage figure you need to enter into the Energy Made Easy site to compare gas offers.

## Tariff blocks

Sometimes your plan will include block tariffs, where one block or quantity of usage is charged at a different rate to the next. For example, under the plan on this sample bill:

- the first 4000 MJ were charged at 2.52 cents per MJ, and
- the remaining 4763 MJ were charged at 2.32 cents per MJ.

## Daily supply charge

This is the cost of getting gas to your place, even if you don't use any. It is a fixed amount.

The <u>daily supply charge</u> [5] is also known as the:

- service to property charge, or
- fixed charge.

### **Government energy concessions**

If you receive a government energy <u>concession</u> [6], you will see a credit on your bill.
